## Art Open House

The end of April signals the time for Garfield's Annual Art Open House. On this **Friday, May 2nd at 8:30** the school bell will ring to signal everyone to gather. Children who do not have family members available may tour with a school staff member.

## CAASPP - State Testing

Students in grades 3-6 will be participating in the CAASPP (California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress) test from **May 5th – May 23rd**. The language arts and math tests are computer-based. To help students gain confidence with test taking skills using the computer format, students will have opportunities to take practice tests the week prior to the actual test. The CAASPP test results help students and teachers identify their strengths and areas in need of support. This in turn, becomes one factor that helps us determine goals for our school plan, known as the Local Control Accountability Plan or LCAP.

You can help your child approach testing with a positive attitude in a number of ways:

- Be sure your child gets adequate sleep each night.
- Because testing takes more energy than the usual day, provide good nutrition in the morning, as well as extra snacks to supplement lunch.
- Plan on down-time for relaxation and play in the afternoons and evenings.
- Remind your child to use positive self-talk. Positive self-talk is when we encourage ourselves with affirming and positive statements: "I'll do my best. It will be okay." If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to check in with your child's teacher.
